<u>Range News:</u> NEW GATE: "Look out, 'cause the A.M.L.G.C. is using technology...!" We've got a nice, easy to use GATE with electronic access, thanks very, very much to volunteers, Clif Denny, Paul Paterson, and Gary Quandt our Range Officer! With the new gate, one simply adds in a three digit code: number, number, number, number, and then the "#" key, also known as the "pound sign" and increasingly these days, thanks to the tweetings and tweets of those who follow that kind of thing, the "hashtag" symbol. So: as an example: "1,2,3,4, #." The gate will automatically swing open, and it will close behind your vehicle after you drive in. There is no longer a need to exit your vehicle to close the gate, and of course, this obviates the use of the combination padlock. For the time being, *the current code or access numbers from the padlock are the same as those to access the electronic gate.* After the yearly business meeting in January 2020, the last four digits of your Texas Drivers License will serve as *your own personal membership access code.* For that reason, as will be discussed under "Membership Renewal" below, attentive readers will see that we need a copy of your license with the number along with the lien release and membership fee.

HELP POLICE THE RANGE: For the most part, things are copacetic at the range facility—there has not been any deliberate vandalism of late, and the physical plant is mostly OK. If range users could help out with

ensuring that old targets, paper, packaging, empty containers, etc.—particularly on the firing lines—gets put in the trash cans, that would be very helpful and most welcome. "Pack it in? Then, please, pack it out."

Flouting the rules: This buster, pictured below, is using a smooth bore shotgun on the pistol range. The sign clearly says that shotguns at this time are *verboten* on the pistol range. The rules apply to him as much as they do to all members. We may not like one or another rule, but we do agree to abide by them. It's part of our contract and obligations when we become members. Fortunately, this guy didn't appear to knock out one of the target frames. Take it from me, the author of this missive: Defensive shotgun training in the Bexar County/ Central Texas area is available, and is not prohibitively expensive. Just not at our range. A defensive shotgun class allows one to really "run the gun," pattern it with buck shot, learn all sorts of drills, the use of cover, and really understand the ins and outs, advantages and disadvantages of the hoary old pump-action and new-fangled self-loading "police cruiser" and other such defensive arms. No, the shotgun has not been entirely supplanted by the self-loading carbine, and still offers the dedicated user a lot of effectiveness for the money spent on it. I highly recommend such a course for anyone so interested. Follow-up courses offer a chance to refresh skills and introduce what might be new.

In the meantime, please respect the posted signs, and follow the rules. They are in place for the enjoyment and safety of all our members.



SAFETY ALERT: A member brought to the Board of Directors a safety concern. Someone was shooting at the range at some really nifty and cool "push in ground" "Original Woody's Targets TM— Rifle•Pistol•Rimfire•Air Gun" #15 Prairie Dog. These are really neat! They are made of a slat of heavyweight cardboard/ fiberboard material, with an image of the little furry rascal varmint, and a high-visibility day-glow aiming bulls-eye superimposed. So what was the issue? Well, these targets are pushed into the ground, and then the user fires at them... And there is a ricochet hazard. To demonstrate, one of the targets actually had evidence of a ricochet that had bounced up of the ground and tore through the target. Fortunately, these targets have a little hole where the critter's eye would be. The Board of Directors will not have a problem with these targets provided they are mounted on the regular backboard within a target frame. The issue is that all shots fired should go straight into the back stop or earthen berm. So while these are designed to be "pushed into the ground," and thereby resemble varmints close to their burrows, they can be *safely used* simply by hanging them or mounting them from one of the target frames. Please do give some thought to how a particular piece of equipment can be *most safely used* on our range facility. Thanks!

DO NOT SHOOT AT TRASH! Or old FRUIT! So, as one might expect, perhaps, from a double-issue of *SMOKE SIGNAL* we have a bonus! Extra scolding! In keeping with the above stated need to properly police the range and ensure it is ready for use, we have clear rules to not shoot at trash or litter. But some people shoot at cardboard boxes—with their names and addresses left on, I might add?—and still others wanted some reactive targets. I'd be the first to agree that there may be something hard-wired in us with an urge to splatter things. In this case, someone shot up a bunch of pears. The resultant mess was then left for the wildlife to consume, I guess. Most such wildlife included insects, bugs, flies, and so on. So again, let's be sure to pick up after ourselves, *mmkay*?

FOR SALE: A freshly painted Steen Cannons-mfr. Tredegar 2-1/4" mountain rifle. This is the artillery tube only, no carriage. These so-called "mountain rifles" had three-groove, saw tooth rifling, with a rate of twist of 1 turn in 10 feet. Often referred to as the Model 1862, the 44-in. tube weighed about 190 pounds, remarkably light for muzzle-loading ordnance. It is made of iron and has a steel liner for the bore and rifling. When 1 February rolls around, and the key code changes, you will simply use your license digits—the last four—followed by the "#" sign to open the range gate. 2. Your NRA or NMLRA membership number, so that we know you can be insured. 3. A signed lien release statement. 4. The membership fee of \$125, unless you are a brand new member, in which case it would cost you \$150. Looking forward to seeing everyone!


