Happy New Year! Out with the old 2020, in with the new 2021! Hope you and yours had a pleasant and restful holiday season!

RENEWED YET? With a new year, comes the need to renew your membership unless you are a life member—with the Alamo Muzzle Loading Gun Club. Come February, your gate access code will be switched off if you have not done so by then.

Q: "How do I renew?" A: Two things: 1)"Fill out and sign a lien release form for the year 2021, which is required for legal reasons. We can't just 'roll over' or 'grandfather' you 2020 lien release, unfortunately. While that would be simpler, and is what we'll do with your redacted license on file, we cannot with the lien release. So be sure to include the lien release." 2) "Write out a check, or get a money order, for \$125.00 USD made out to the Alamo Muzzle Loading Gun Club for your 2021 membership dues." A number of new members and prospects showed up to the 2 January yearly business meeting, and others to the first Sunday 3 January shoot at various targets on the 25 and 50-yd. ranges! Clif Denny is the Match director. Dennis Rich continues on as Vice President. John Burke, Sr. serves as the Treasurer. Gary Quandt is the chief Range safety officer and maintenance coordinator. ALAMO MUZZLE LOADING GUN CLUB 2021 MATCH SCHEDULE

(Make a copy of this for your refrigerator door or calendar. A copy will go on the club house bulletin board at the range.)

Watch for added dates, including updated events, and the Civil War skirmish schedule!

- 3 January various targets at 25 and 50-yds. and a 25-yd. pistol shoot.
- 7 February—bench shoot, 50 and 100-yds. Round bulls-eye targets.
- 7 March—Ground hog and 6-bull targets at 25-yds. 3-bull and bear targets at 50-yds. 25-yd. pistol shoot.
- 4 April—The 40-shot club silhouette shoot.
- 2 May—cross sticks at buffalo targets, 50 and 100-yds.
- 6 June—The blanket shoot: bring a trade item worth approx. 10 dollars, or ten dollars. Winner takes first pick off the blanket. "Nightmare" & squirrel targets at 25-yds., deer and bear targets at 50-yds. 25-yd. pistol shoot.
- 4 July—Happy Independence Day! Watermelon shoot, with silhouette targets at 25 & 50yds.
- 1 August—Bench shoot, round bulls-eye targets at 50 & 100-yds.
- 21 August—Re-enactor shoot.
- 5 September—Animal targets at 25 & 50-yds. Also, a 25-yd. pistol match.
- 3 October Cross-sticks silhouette shoot at 50 & 100 yards.
- 7 November—Turkey shoot. Cross-sticks at buffalo targets at 50 & 100 yards, and a 25-yd. pistol shoot.

5 December—Holiday shoot—the knife shoot, with a knife for grand prize. Round bull targets at 25 & 50-yds. The last 25-yd. pistol shoot of 2021.

*1 or 8 January 2022, TBA. Yearly business meeting.

Match guidelines and rules: All first-Sunday matches will be shot with a 14-lb. maximumweight rifle, any metallic sights. Projectiles will be patched round balls only for rifle matches. National Muzzle Loading Rifle Assn., Texas Muzzle Loading Rifle Assn., National Rifle Assn., and local AMLG club rules will apply for all matches. All matches start at 9am, so come earlier for set up, particularly if you want to practice. We will have four to 6 (4 to 6) relays for the rifle matches. Pistil matches may use round ball or conical bullets. Revolvers must use coated or treated wads or grease to prevent chain fires, or, only load one chamber at a time. Shooters will have to make 6 shots or matches to qualify for awards in the rifle and 3 pistol shoots total to qualify for awards in pistol categories. There will be two (2) "floating" classes: 1/3rd will be A-class, and 2/3rds will be B-class. If a shooter misses a match because he or she attended a conflicting TMLRA or N-SSA match, there will be an opportunity to make up a match upon request. The make-up match will be scheduled before the next first Sunday club match on a date set by the match committee. A member of the board of directors will be present to witness the make-up.

2 January 2021 Business Meeting:

Thank goodness for beautiful weather and mild temperatures! The yearly meeting was held on the first Saturday of the new year, 2 Jan 2021 at the club's private range in La Coste, Medina Co., Texas. Due to the pandemic precautions, the meeting was held out of doors, with participants bringing their own chairs to sit on. Attendance was good, with approximately 1/3rd of the club's membership and some of their family members turning out. A number of new members also came out.

The officers of the Board of Directors (BoD) gave reports, and questions and input from attendees was elicited. If you've got any curiosity about muzzle loading or black powder, please do consider coming out and giving it a try. On the first Sunday, there is room available, and many members have extra firearms and powder and shot if you'd like to give it a try.

One salient issue for this year is construction and maintenance of our range. Look for announcements of volunteer work parties. In terms of construction, we have to put new roofing over the firing lines, since storms and wear and tear, winds, etc. have put holes in the cladding or sheeting, and some pieces need replacement. The old, now disused shower building will get retrofitted and repurposed into a target storage shed. The old target shed, and the pantry "walk in closet" on the side of the building will be opened up into a larger internal space for the club house, one more conducive to holding meetings, particularly during the ongoing pandemic. The porch and portions of the roof have rotted away, and are long overdue for replacement.

We have to rebuild and shore-up the berms in some instances. Purple paint must be reapplied along the property line, particularly the new acquisition of almost 12 acres, which is leased to a local farmer.

Further, in addition to reinforcing the berms/ back stops, we really would like to separate out the 200-yard and up ranges from the 100-yard and under ranges, so that these can use different range commands like "commence firing" or going "hot" or "cease fire" and going "cold." We need dirt! We need the means of transporting more dirt! The bathrooms need new walls and some other improvements, or even "amenities!" If you've got skills that we could use, please do let a member of the board of directors know!.

RANGE SAFETY—The same New Years Resolution every year!

Guest policy—2 at a time only, or prior notification of more.. Fill out the guest lien release for each and every visit by a non-member (members have their lien releases on file) and pay the ten dollar fee, and put it in the box. It can be difficult to read some handwriting, so try to print. Trespassing with a firearm in Texas is a felony. Don't trespass on our private range.

Firing beyond the firing line: Do not walk forward of the line to shoot at the target. Remain on the firing line. We don't move and shoot here. Go elsewhere for that type of sport. We will find you, and you'll have to go before the board.

No modern centerfire rifle shooting on lanes 1-7 on the 100 yard line. There is a house 1,700 yards away. So we cannot have modern firearms at those seven lanes. Some four gun ranges in Travis Co. have been shut down because of lawsuits. We could easily go the same way—so SAFETY is everyones' priority and responsibility!... So please, keep all shots in the berm. Remember: ALL SHOTS MUST IMPACT the BERM!
