May 28th work party: When I arrived at 8:10 there were two members ahead of me! We ended with nine people – so participation was up 12.5%! Admittedly that was still thin participation for a club of 147 paid memberships, but those who came, worked well; and we accomplished these things: Roofed about 200 square feet of the range house roof (but at least as much is needed to finish.) Finished painting the red firing line stripe. Cut and put out new target backers. Alan Pinel tied a wheel on the gate to take some of the strain off the hinge bolts. Trimmed tree limbs that partly blocked line of sight to the 385 meter target line, and branches blocking the door to the skirmish cage. On the south end of our range, picked up the wire and tied it to the corner post and clipped it to the fence posts, where the previous two work parties had cleared brush and put in posts. Restored wire closing the west end of the gas company easement, near the 385 meter line. Posted no-trespassing signs where the fence work was done. Trimmed tree branches so you can park under trees behind the 25 yard line. Killed wasps! The most important thing we didn't do was to fix the tin roof on the 50 yard line. But if you get rained on there, don't blame us who worked. Those include: Paul Paterson, Chuck Rine, Richard Fulk, Ian Straus, Alan Pinel, Gary Quandt, Dennis Rich, Rich Beardsley, Mike Benet.

When the weather gets cooler we will schedule another work party.



annual membership renewal season. As a reminder a new signed Liability Waiver must be included in your renewal package for EACH PERSON OVER 18 ON YOUR FAMILY MEMBERSHIP. This is a new requirement this year. An adult cannot enter a waiver of liability on behalf of another adult. Therefore, each adult within your family membership must complete their own signed liability waiver.

Also, as a reminder ALL MEMEBERS that bring guests to the range MUST have that guest fill out and sign a GUEST LIABILITY WAIVER with a \$10 guest range fee. All range rules apply to all members.

Thanks to those that participated in the May 28th Work Party. Some fencing was repaired, and trees trimmed. Target backers cut. We are extremely grateful to the two members that spent hours shingling the roof of the range clubhouse. While I'm grateful to those that showed up, turn out was low. I even witnessed a member that began to drive a few yards into the gate, only to see others working and backed out and left the property. Our club needs the volunteerism of its members to maintain its facilities. I honestly feel like a "broken record" having to say the same thing after each work party. Out of membership of over 150, it is the same 6-8 persons that faithfully participate in work parties to pitch in. It's truly a case of the few carrying the weight of the many. It is apparent that it's going to be necessary to begin contracting out much of the maintenance which unfortunately means a discussion would need to be had regarding a substantial dues rate increase to pay for maintenance services. members is unsustainable. Please be on the lookout in the newsletter for future Work Party dates.


